> Articulation Agreement Champlain Valley Education Services BOCES And North Country Community College

The intent of this articulation agreement is to develop an ongoing relationship between North Country Community College and the Champlain Valley Education Services (CYTEC), which will enable both institutions to meet the needs of the students. This agreement will prevent unnecessary duplication of instruction and will allow the student at North Country Community College to receive advanced placement credit in a more effective manner.

Upon evaluating course outlines and requirements, North Country Community College agrees to give advanced placement to admitted students for the following courses:

The process for the student to follow is to:

- (1) Notify the college Enrollment Management representative of their intent to qualify for advanced standing.
- Register with NCCC Enrollment Management a departmentally approved nursing equivalency (2) examination.
- Register for the Examination no later than April 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the Fall Semester of planned (3) enrollment.
- Successfully pass the departmentally approved nursing equivalency. (4)
- Request that a letter of reference from the instructor be forwarded to the Enrollment (5) Management Office on the Saranac Lake Campus indicating that the student achieved a grade of B (80%) or higher and his/her achievement level was collegiate in nature. The articulation agreement may be reviewed at the request of either party and contains no expiration date. Each party is responsible for notification of programmatic changes when they occur.

All other enrollment eligibility requirements must be met by incoming students in a timely fashion. The A.D.N. program is highly competitive with many more applicants than available space. This agreement does not guarantee enrollment but a granting of credits upon admission.
