



AA: Liberal Arts & Science: Humanities & Social Science

At the completion of this degree program, students will be able to do the following:

1. Students will demonstrate knowledge of the human condition and human cultures, specifically behaviors, ideas, and values expressed in works of art, literature, music, and philosophy that promote appreciation and understanding of the fundamental role of arts and humanities in cultural health and survival.
2. Students will demonstrate knowledge of major concepts, models, and issues of at least one discipline in the social sciences as well as the accepted methods of studying behaviors and interactions among individuals and groups in society.
3. Students will demonstrate knowledge of either a broad outline of world history, or the distinctive features of the history, institutions, economy, society, culture in Western and non-Western civilizations. Students will be able to relate the development of Western civilization to that of other regions of the world.
4. Students will demonstrate knowledge of a basic narrative of America: historical, political, economic, social, and cultural, including knowledge of unity and diversity in American society.
5. Students will demonstrate the ability to analyze and produce coherent, college-level texts as well as support assertions with evidence.
6. Students will create works of art, drama, music, film and/or literature that demonstrate at least minimal technical skill in those media.
7. Students will demonstrate proficiency in oral presentation and the evaluation of such.
8. Students will demonstrate an understanding of scientific methodology and theory, including observation, hypothesis development, measurement and data collection, experimentation, evaluation of evidence and employment of mathematical and interpretive analysis.
